New Zealand Citizen Family Relationship (Temporary) (subclass 461) visa Document Checklist Vietnam

Important:

- Please note that all foreign language documents submitted with your application **must** be accompanied by a certified English translation.
- Either of the following document types will be accepted when submitted with your application:
 - A certified copy of an original document, or
 - Scanned or electronic copies of the original document where the quality of the scan is a minimum of 300 dpi in 24 colour and saved as a jpg image or pdf file at a good quality setting.
- Certified copies must be authorised or stamped as being true copies of the original document by the local authority in Vietnam. In Australia, documents may be certified by a person before whom a statutory declaration may be made under the Statutory Declarations Act, 1959. - Do not send photocopies of certified documents.

Where to Apply:

You must apply for this visa on paper. In Vietnam, you can lodge your application at **Australian Visa Application Centre.**

Personal documents		
Two recent passport-sized photographs (45 mm x 35 mm) of each person included in the application.		
 These photographs should be of the head and shoulders only against a plain background. 		
Print the name of the person on the back of each photograph.		
Certified copies of the biographical pages of the current passports or travel documents of all people included in the application (these are the pages with the holder's photo and personal details and the issue/expiry dates).		
If your name has changed or the name of anyone included in your application has changed: a certified copy of evidence of the name change.		
Certified copies of birth certificates for you and any other person included in the application. The certificates must show the names of both parents of your dependent children.		
Certified copy of all pages of the applicant's current Household Registration Book.		
Certified copies of marriage certificates or relationship registrations.		
If you are living in a de facto relationship: independent evidence that your relationship is genuine and continuing (for example, joint bank account statements, billing accounts in joint names or joint ownership of major assets).		
If you or anyone included in the application has been widowed, divorced or permanently separated: a certified copy of the death certificate, divorce documents, or <u>statutory declaration</u> separation documents.

For applicants aged under 18 years		
Where a non-migrating parent or other person has the legal right to determine where the child can live, please provide:		
Written consent for the child to migrate to Australia from the non-migrating parent using the template available on our website https://hcmc.vietnam.embassy.gov.au/files/hchi/Consent%20form%20to%20a%20child%20 under%20age%20of%2018%20years.%20v20200304.pdf		

The signature of the non-migrating parent on the consent must be verified by the local authorities/public notary; and	
 Certified copy of the non-migrating parent's Identity Card; and 	
 For adopted children, please also provide the official Decision on Recognition of Child Adoption, including a Record of Receipt and Handing-Over a Child Adoption. 	
If it is not possible to obtain a consent from the non-migrating parent, you will need to provide a court order stating that the migrating parent has sole custody and is allowed to move the child to Australia.	
Character documents	
Police checks for everyone included in the visa application who is 16 years of age or older:	
 an Australian National Police Check for anyone who has spent a cumulative total of 12 months or more in Australia since turning 16 years of age 	
 police certificates from each country in which anyone in your application has spent a cumulative total of 12 months or more in the past 10 years since turning 16 years of age. This included the applicant's country of residence. 	
Important: Information on what Police Certificate(s) are required from other countries is specified at this link, we will not accept any other type of Police Certificate. For Vietnam, the Judicial Record Card Number 2 issued by the local Service of Justice is required. For Australia, a National Police Certificate from Australian Federal Police, Complete Disclosure is required.

If anyone included in the application has served in the armed forces of any country: certified copies of their military service record or discharge papers.	
Evidence of your relationship to the New Zealand citizen	
Evidence that the New Zealand citizen holds or is eligible for a Special Category visa (subclass 444). This can include:	
 a certified copy of the New Zealand citizen's birth certificate 	
a New Zealand passport.	
Written statements signed by the applicant and sponsor should cover the history of your relationship (in chronological order), such as:	
 how, when and where you first met 	
 how your relationship developed when you become engaged er/and married, if englished 	
 when you became engaged or/and married, if applicable joint activities 	
periods of separation	
significant events in the relationshipyour future plans together	
Evidence that shows you are committed to each other your long-term relationship.	
This may include:	
 photographs and other evidence of your time spent together (holidays and other social, cultural or religious occasions); 	
 knowledge of each other's personal circumstances such as background and family 	
situation;documents that show you have combined your personal matters;	
evidence that shows you have been in contact when apart.	
Evidence that shows your relationship is known by others, for example:	
 joint invitations, going out together, friends and acquaintances in common 	
 proof that you and your fiancé/partner have declared your relationship to government bodies, commercial or public institutions 	
 proof of joint sporting, cultural or social activities proof of joint travel 	

proof of joint travel.

 Evidence that shows you and your partner share household responsibilities, for example: joint responsibility for children your living arrangements 	
Evidence of any joint financial undertakings, where relevant to your application. This may include joint bank accounts, invoices/bills in both names, etc.	
If the main applicant is living with the sponsor, evidence of this cohabitation, such as details of the sponsor's temporary residence in Vietnam.	
Important: A CD or DVD containing photographs and other evidence of your time together is acceptable. Please do not provide photographs on memory sticks or any other form of media.	
If the visa applicant and the New Zealand Citizen were previously married, engaged or living in a de facto relationship:	
• Written statement that lists your former partner's name(s), date of birth, residential address where you both lived and when your relationship ended.	
If the visa applicant and the New Zealand Citizen were previously married:	
Certified copy of your Divorce Certificate	
If the visa applicant and the New Zealand Citizen are a widow/er:	
Certified copy of your former partner's Death Certificate.
